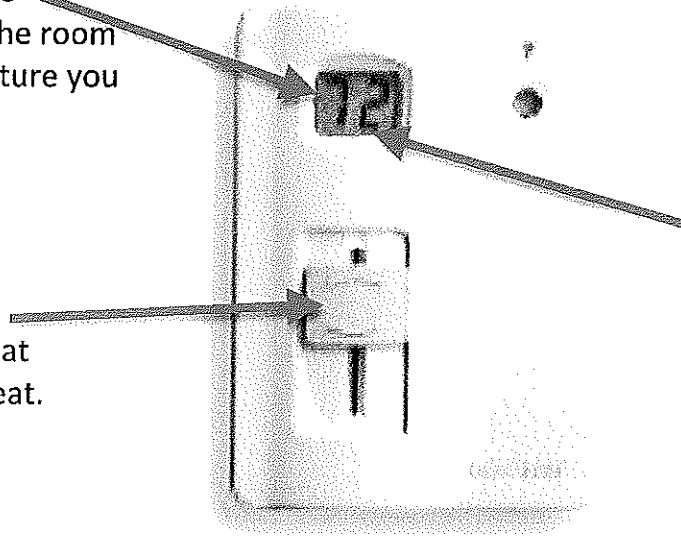


Getting the Most from Your Heat

Display shows the temperature in the room and the temperature you adjust to.



A small dot indicates when the thermostat is calling the boiler room to send more heat to your room.

Slide up for more heat and down for less heat.

If you want a warmer temperature, slide the bar up.

If it is too warm, slide the bar down. The display will show the new temperature setting you have selected before returning to show the room temperature. Please do not open windows to reduce room temperature. Use your thermostat instead.

Thermostats observe the temperature of the room they are in to be able to deliver heat to the whole apartment.

During the day, when the room temperature is 72° F or higher – no heat will be delivered. Radiators will feel cool.

A space heater can trick a thermostat.

Keep space heaters away from thermostats.
For Safety, turn off space heaters when you go out.

A dark room tricks a thermostat into thinking no one is home and that less heat is needed.

If your curtains or drapes hang low enough to cover the radiator, the heat rises behind the curtains and warms your window pane, instead of your room. Keep the area in front of the radiator clear of things like drapes and furniture as much as possible. This will help the heat spread more evenly around your rooms.
